TAPS FOR VETERANS BUGLER, JACKSONVILLE, FL.)

### 'EVERYDAY IS MEMORIAL DAY SOMEWHERE'

As I stand on a hillside overlooking Emmitsburg, Md., preparing to sound taps in tribute to my uncle, retired Navy Capt. John Henry Baker, I realize that everyday is Memorial Day somewhere. We set aside one day a year for a national day of remembrance, but across the country on any given day, there are taps buglers, honor guards, families and friends remembering and mourning someone.

For me, sounding taps is an immersive, soulful experience. Every note, every breath, every musical phrase must be from the heart, exact, respectful, reverent, and solid. There's no room for error, no going through the motions.

Over the years, I have sounded live taps hundreds of times; in national and local cemeteries, in churches, and American Legion halls, on ships and historic battlefields. Each occasion has been a personal statement of thanks and respect. As May begins, I'm preparing for three Vietnam Veterans Day ceremonies and know Memorial Day is fast approaching, with multiple ceremonies, too. Through it all, I await the unscheduled calls that will come for graveside or funeral taps of those called to their final duty station. Each is a Memorial Day for someone, and I will honor it as such.

"Four men, three faiths, one God. It was their underlying strength to do God's work, on that fateful February morning in 1943, that remains the reason why so many make a pilgrimage here."

Patriots still travel to Saint Stephen's Church in Kearny, New Jersey, to pay tribute to four military chaplains: Rev. George Fox, Rabbi Alexander Goode, Fr. John Washington and Rev. Clark Poling who sacrificed their lives for their men. Each of them gave their life-jackets to fellow soldiers as their troop transport sank in the icy North Atlantic following a German U-boat attack. Inside the church is the Sanctuary of the Four Chaplains and outside a monument depicting the four men praying together on the Dorchester's deck as it sank.
